From groundbreaking technology to experiential learning,
YOUR support made the difference!

A profound **THANK YOU** to donors and supporters of the North Penn School District Educational Foundation. Your support allows our teachers to dream and innovate, raising the student experience to new heights. Thanks to your support, the Foundation was able to fund 50 grants that expanded the stellar education provided by the North Penn School District.

The Foundation strives to motivate and inspire students and staff in the North Penn School District through innovative projects and opportunities that enhance educational experiences and resources. Grants ranged from \$69.96 for an art drying rack to be used in conjunction with the Wit and Wisdom curriculum to \$38,500 for the Hitachi TM4000+ Scanning Electron Microscope.

Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) funding supported high-impact grants: a new Seestar S50 Smart Telescope for the planetarium, stem robotics in an elementary school, and marine science improvements. The Foundation partnered with NPSD to purchase the HitachiTM 4000+ Scanning Electron Microscope (SEM) for North Penn High School, the only high school in the US to own an SEM.

North Wales Elementary's mosaic mural project invited over 460 students and community members to create clay tiles that will become a vibrant mural and point of community pride. Other hands-on grants include empanada cooking for Spanish classes at Pennfield, monster sewing projects connecting Pennbrook and Gwyn-Nor students, and innovating ceramics with 3-D technology at North Penn High School.

Some grants aimed to build skills, including a deep dive into various forms of 21st-century manufacturing, and a laser cutting machine for Gwynedd Square Elementary students. Other grants supported students in motion, including an accessible playground for Bridle Path Elementary and a stationary bike for active learning at North Wales Elementary.

CONSTITUENT SURVEY

The NPSD Educational Foundation invited community members to participate in a survey aimed at guiding its strategic planning. Working with Match Nonprofit Consulting, the Foundation carried out an organizational assessment. The valuable insights collected played a key role in shaping the assessment and influencing future initiatives. Based on the survey, the top recommendations for the foundation are to center on strengthening its infrastructure to better support growth and remove barriers, as well as increasing board engagement in fundraising. Building greater brand awareness is also a priority, alongside focusing on revitalizing the annual campaign and diversifying the fundraising mix to reduce reliance on special events. In addition, the survey suggests initiating a major gifts program to attract higherlevel donors, while developing a formal strategic plan, though ranked lowest, remains an important long-term consideration.



Impact starts here

The Foundation's Board is made up of trustees representing a cross-section of the community. These dedicated volunteers contribute their time, talents, and expertise to help raise both the funds and awareness necessary to advance the Foundation's mission. Throughout the school year, trustees often visit classrooms to see grants in action, connect with students and teachers, take part in fundraising initiatives, and attend events that spotlight and promote the Foundation's work.

Educational Improvement TAX CREDIT PROGRAM

Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) provides companies with a 75% tax credit for donations to a non-profit scholarship or educational improvement organization. The tax credit increases to 90% if the company commits to making the same donations for two consecutive years. The NPSD Educational Foundation has a number of programs approved to receive EITC funding, including the **Scanning Electron Microscopy project.** The Foundation has two years to spend EITC dollars.

HITACHI TM4000+ SCANNING ELECTRON MICROSCOPE

Total Awarded: \$38,500 | North Penn High School | Technology Education/Engineering North Penn School District Funded an Additional \$27,500

NPHS students have access to advanced characterization equipment, including the newly acquired Hitachi TM 4000+ Scanning Electron Microscope. Once available only on loan, this cutting-edge instrument will now remain permanently at the high school through a partnership with Hitachi. With this addition, NPHS becomes the only high school in the nation to own a scanning electron microscope.

AQUATIC ADVENTURERS ENGAGED AT ADVENTURE AQUARIUM

Total Awarded: \$1,537

Oak Park Elementary School | English Language Development

Sixty English Learners from Oak Park explored a wide array of aquatic creatures at Adventure Aquarium in Camden, NJ. This grant allowed students to expand their background knowledge and vocabulary by experiencing a simulated natural environment with numerous hands-on activities.



North Wales launched a mosaic mural project, giving more than 460 students the chance to engage in hands-on artistic expression, fostering creativity and a strong sense of community pride. Working alongside professional artists and community members, students helped design and create a vibrant mural that not only beautified the school, but also promoted inclusivity, encouraged teamwork, and supported social-emotional growth. The Foundation was pleased to partner with several other community organizations to fund this project.



TECH ON THE COURSE

NORTH PENN BOYS CROSS COUNTRY: UPGRADING **OUR PREPARATION TO GO FARTHER**

Total Awarded: \$1,757.97 North Penn High School | Physical Fitness

The NPHS boys cross country team enhanced their preparation and safety with the addition of two iPads with cellular data, weatherproof cases, and a wireless printer. These technology upgrades improved data collection, communication, and overall efficiency by providing performance tools essential for a boundaryless sport like cross country. By keeping coaches, team members, and the community connected throughout their "journey of a thousand miles," the entire team was empowered to go further.

BRINGING ROBOTS TO LIFE

STEM ROBOTICS

Total Awarded: \$1,379.93 Gwynedd Square | STEM

Students gained hands-on STEM experience by building, programming, and completing tasks with their engineered robots. They observed the evolution from basic robots to more advanced models that can serve multiple purposes throughout the school.



CLAY AND COLOR: INSPIRING CREATIVITY THROUGH CERAMIC ART AND SPECIALTY GLAZES

Total Awarded: \$1,070
Pennfield Middle School | Music and Arts

Students were introduced to both the creative and technical sides of ceramic art. By working with specialty glazes that produce unique surface effects, students explored color, texture, and form, helping to develop their own pieces. They also learned the science behind ceramics, including how glazes change during firing.

ALL THAT JAZZ

KNIGHT OF JAZZ

Total Awarded: \$850 District-Wide | Music and Arts

The annual Knight of Jazz brings together all seven North Penn jazz groups to celebrate the district's rich jazz tradition. Each year, a featured guest jazz artist joins the event, working with each group during rehearsals and clinics before taking the stage to perform one piece with each ensemble during the concert.





RASPBERRY PI MAKERSPACE

Total Awarded: \$1,933

North Penn High School | Technology Education/Engineering

Students in the CHASE Club and Computer Programming Club explored the Raspberry Pi platform and developed devices that can automate tasks, collect and analyze data, and run programmed games. This space encouraged students to go beyond current programming and electronics courses, fostering creativity and enabling them to design new applications.

BLENDING ART AND LITERACY

WIT AND WISDOM ART IN THE CLASSROOM

Total Awarded: \$69.96

York Avenue Elementary School | Music & Arts, Reading/Writing/Language

Second grade York Avenue students were able to link the Wit and Wisdom language arts curriculum to art by exploring key art elements through a "notice and wonder" approach. Their resulting artwork was able to dry safely with the newly acquired art drying rack.


SCORING BIG IN THE READING SUPER BOWL


